

### NEW CEMETERY IS ATTRACTIVE

#### Much Pains Being Taken to Make It Place of Beauty

MILFORD F. CHAPMAN, SAPIJPA, June 5.—About eight miles east Sapulpa's new burial grounds, the South Heights cemetery, located nearly a mile from the city limits, was opened and the first person buried there.

The plot of ground is an ideal place for a new cemetery and that is the opinion of the architect, the superintendent, W. J. Cunningham, and the city engineer, as well as the many people who are making the new grounds beautiful by the planting of trees.

There are 27 1/2 acres in this place and it is beautiful and this is a wonderful site for such a place. The beautiful rolling ground. The plot is a very good one. Four miles have been proportioned, some of 145 feet each, and these will be made into huge flower beds. As soon as you care to visit the cemetery you will find several miles of trees to keep a piece of ground that is in good condition. Some one must be constantly working on it.

The town fence surrounds the grounds and a big gate at the front has its name of the cemetery on it. A driveway has been made leading from the gate down the center of the grounds and then branches off leading to all parts.

News soon spread and, although this cemetery has only been open for a few days, there are more than 100 graves and there are many all Sapulpa people, as many of them were brought here from Peabody, Drumright, Canton, Boggs and other places. Superintendent Cunningham stated that he had sold quite a number of lots and that it was not unusual for him to be awakened at night by requests from a neighbor town who has heard about the cemetery and has stepped out to purchase a lot for it.

Special work is now being done on the driveway and seven cartloads of dirt have been used on it and more will be put on soon.

When this was first planned the ladies in charge were criticized for wanting such a large piece of ground for such a small town and they were also told it was entirely too far from town. ### SAW DEFECT IN PLANE

French German Attributes Fall to Faulty Distribution of Weight.

WASHINGTON, June 5.—Captain de Lavergne, air attaché of the French embassy, who declared the Sunday that the army Curtiss Eagle amphibian plane which crashed last Saturday night near Indianhead, Md., with a loss of seven lives, was imbalanced, has issued a statement to the army air service in amplification of his previous statement of the accident.

In his statement, which was made public Saturday by the air service, Captain de Lavergne said "the big trouble in the construction of some amphibian planes is to secure the room necessary for the passengers, because with the weight of the machine body is not so great. It is very cumbersome and takes much space, so in this airplane it is certainly true that the center of gravity was carried toward the tail, partly by the last two passengers and the pilot was obliged to lift the tail to avoid stalling, and therefore the loss of the necessary flying speed."

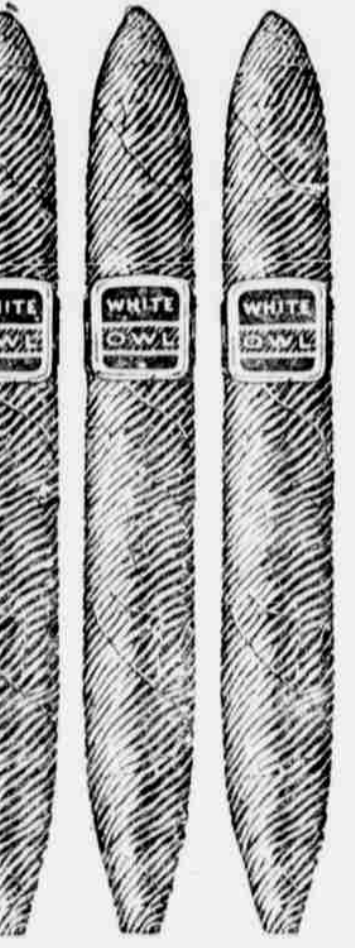
