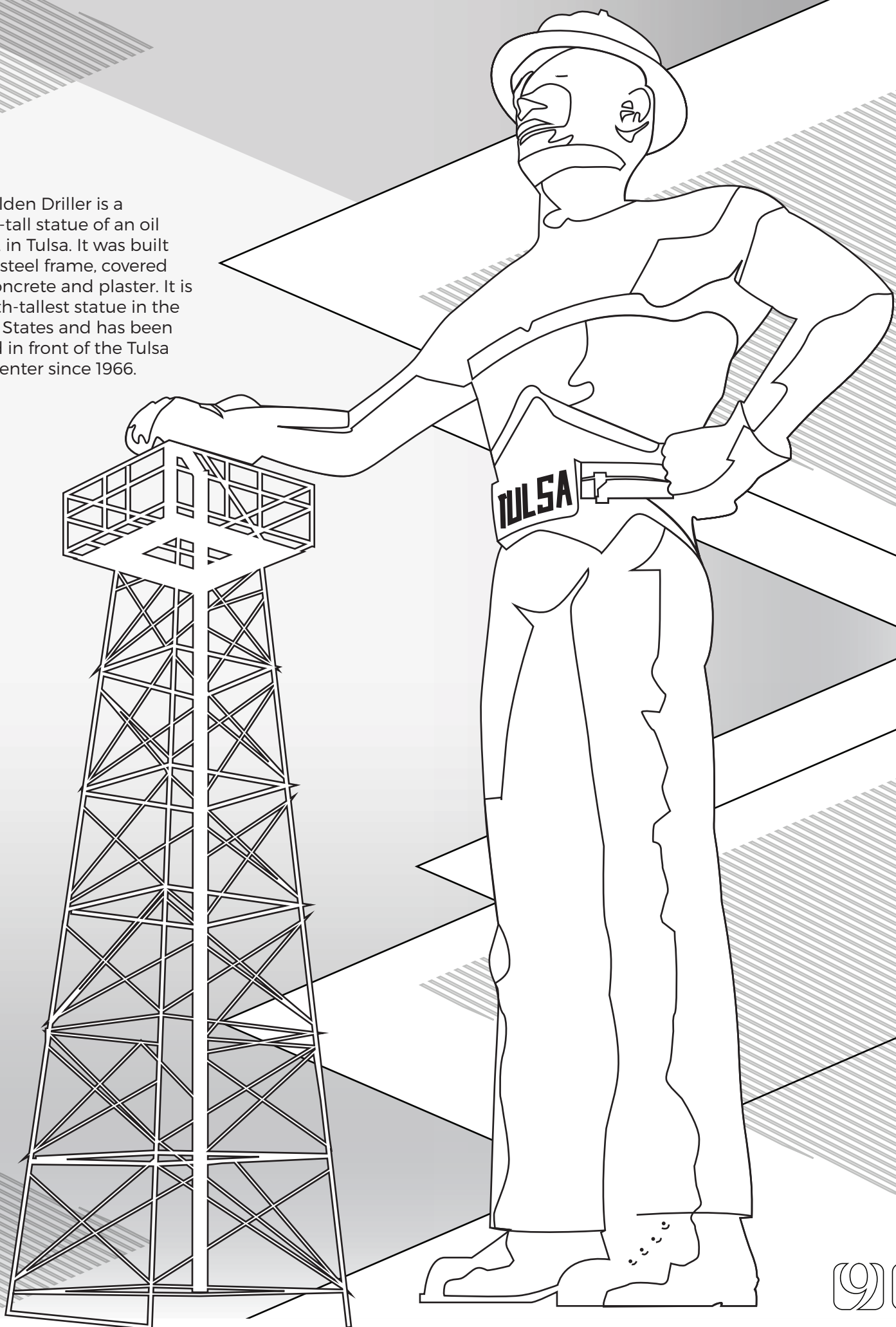


The Flag of Oklahoma was designed by Louise Fluke and adopted in 1925. The flag of the State of Oklahoma consists of a traditional Osage Nation buffalo-skin shield with seven eagle feathers on a Choctaw sky blue field.

Oklahoma is one of America's top producers of petroleum, crude oil, and natural gas. Oil in Oklahoma was first discovered, by accident, in 1859, near Salina, in the then Oklahoma Territory, in a well that had been drilled for salt.

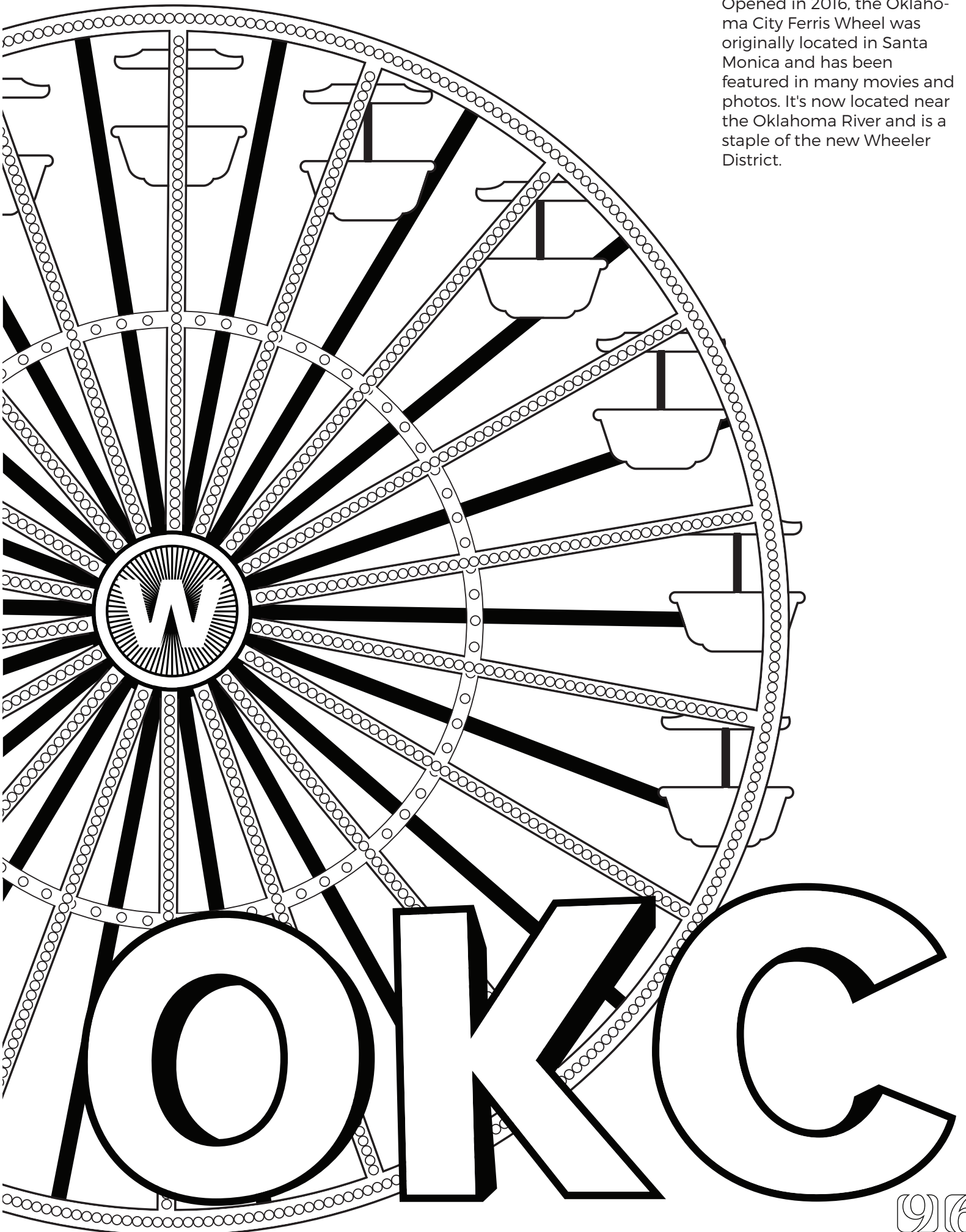


The Golden Driller is a 75-foot-tall statue of an oil worker, in Tulsa. It was built from a steel frame, covered with concrete and plaster. It is the sixth-tallest statue in the United States and has been located in front of the Tulsa Expo Center since 1966.

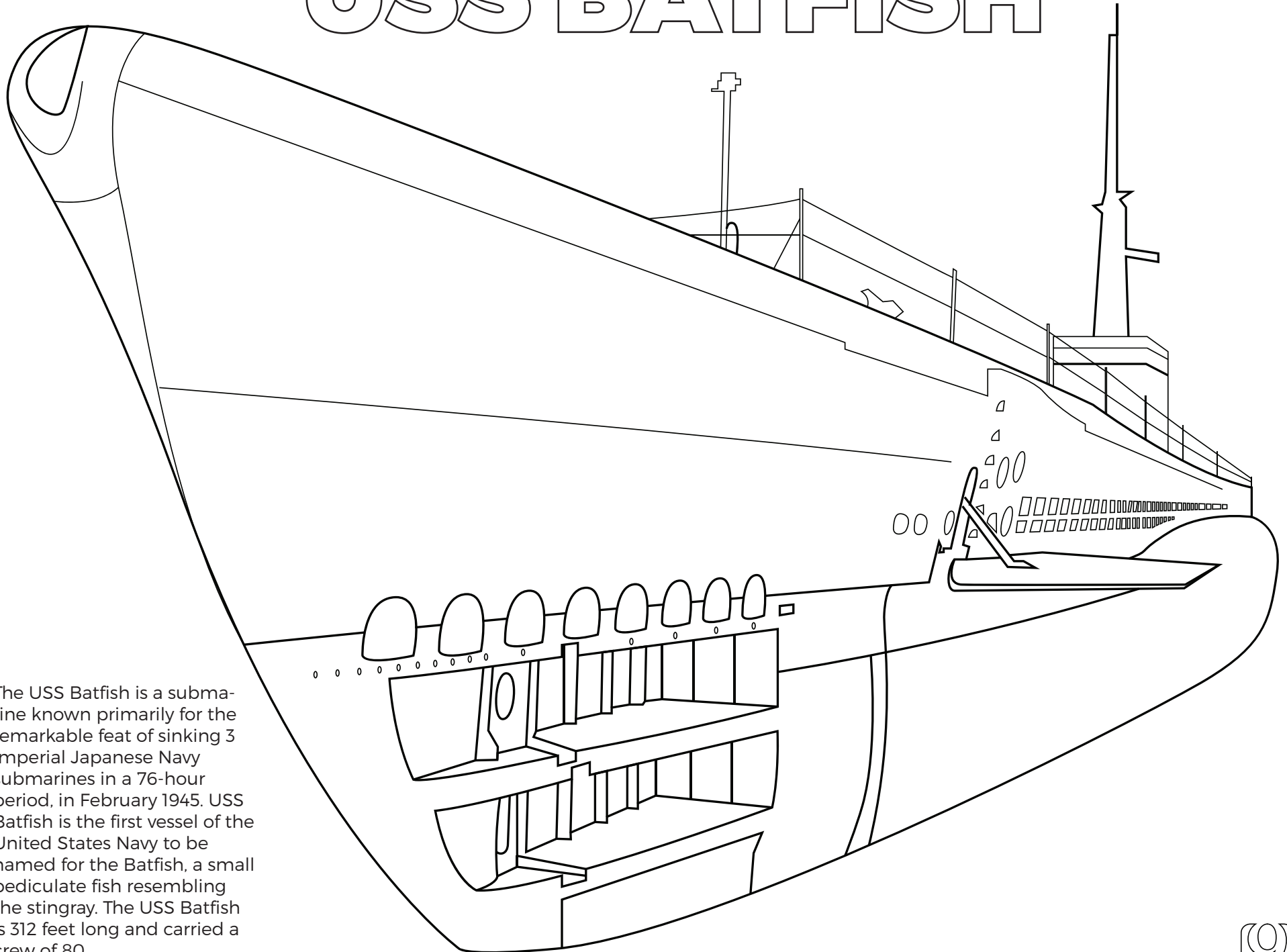




Opened in 2016, the Oklahoma City Ferris Wheel was originally located in Santa Monica and has been featured in many movies and photos. It's now located near the Oklahoma River and is a staple of the new Wheeler District.



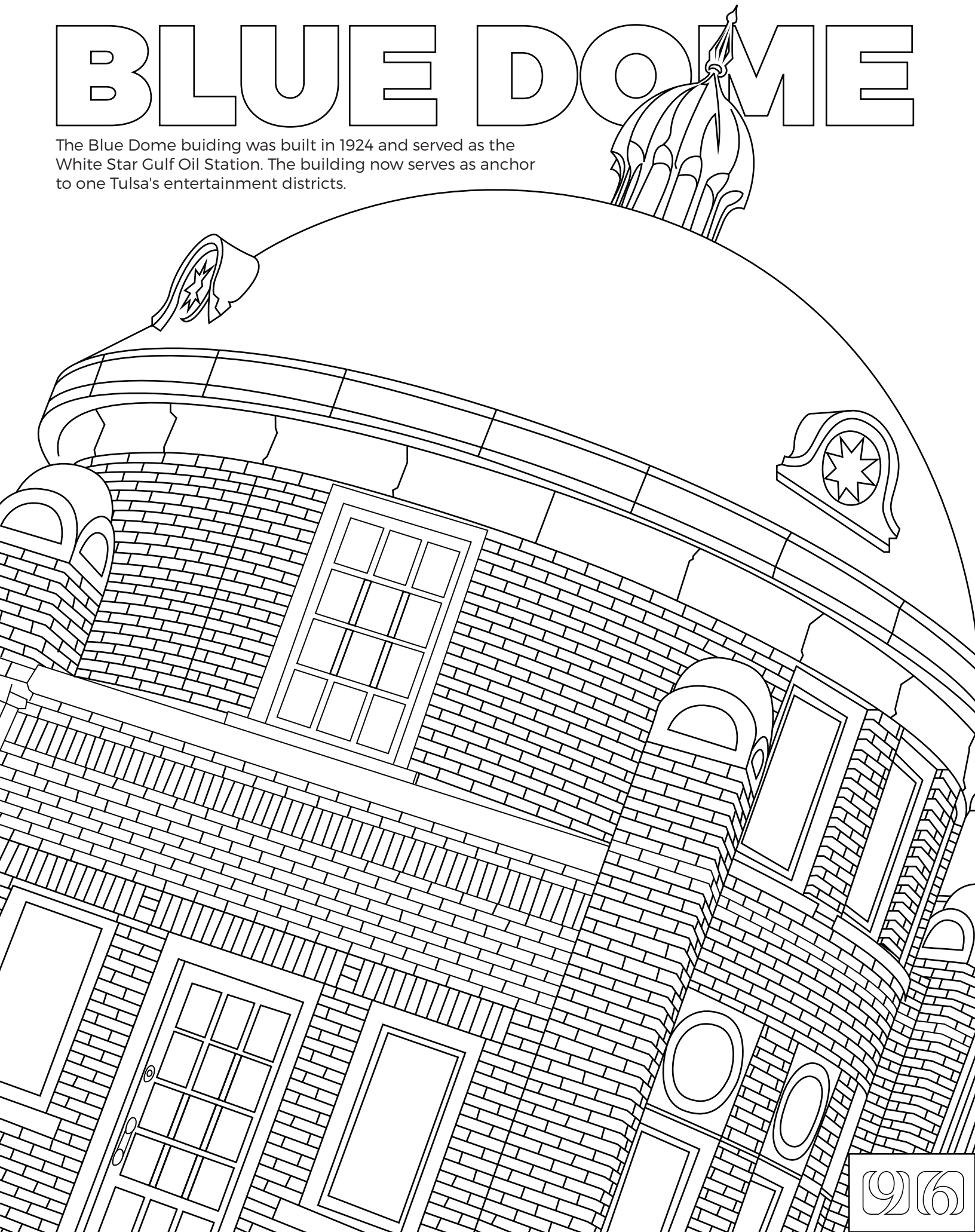
# USS BATFISH



The USS Batfish is a submarine known primarily for the remarkable feat of sinking 3 Imperial Japanese Navy submarines in a 76-hour period, in February 1945. USS Batfish is the first vessel of the United States Navy to be named for the Batfish, a small pediculate fish resembling the stingray. The USS Batfish is 312 feet long and carried a crew of 80.

# BLUE DOME

The Blue Dome building was built in 1924 and served as the White Star Gulf Oil Station. The building now serves as anchor to one Tulsa's entertainment districts.

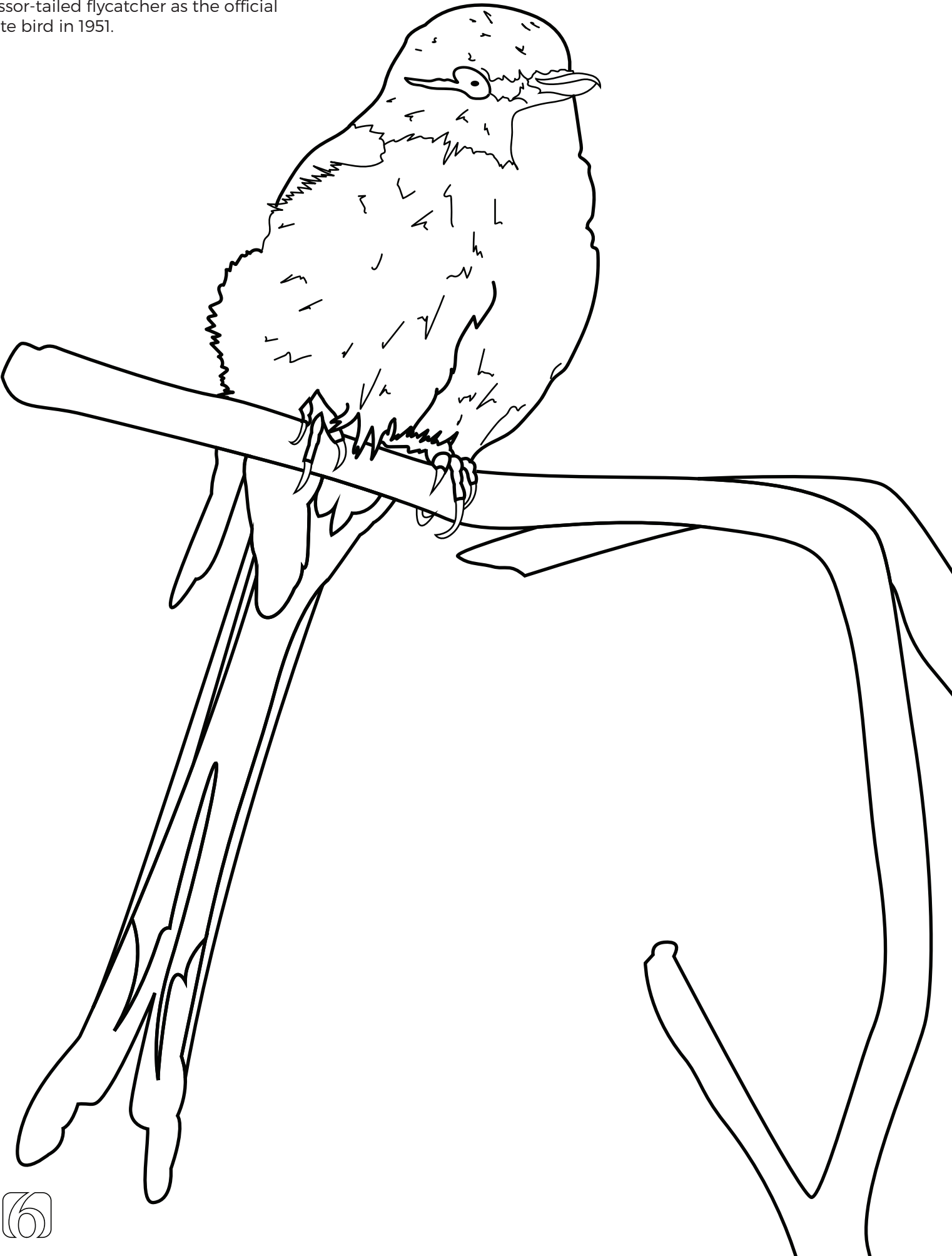

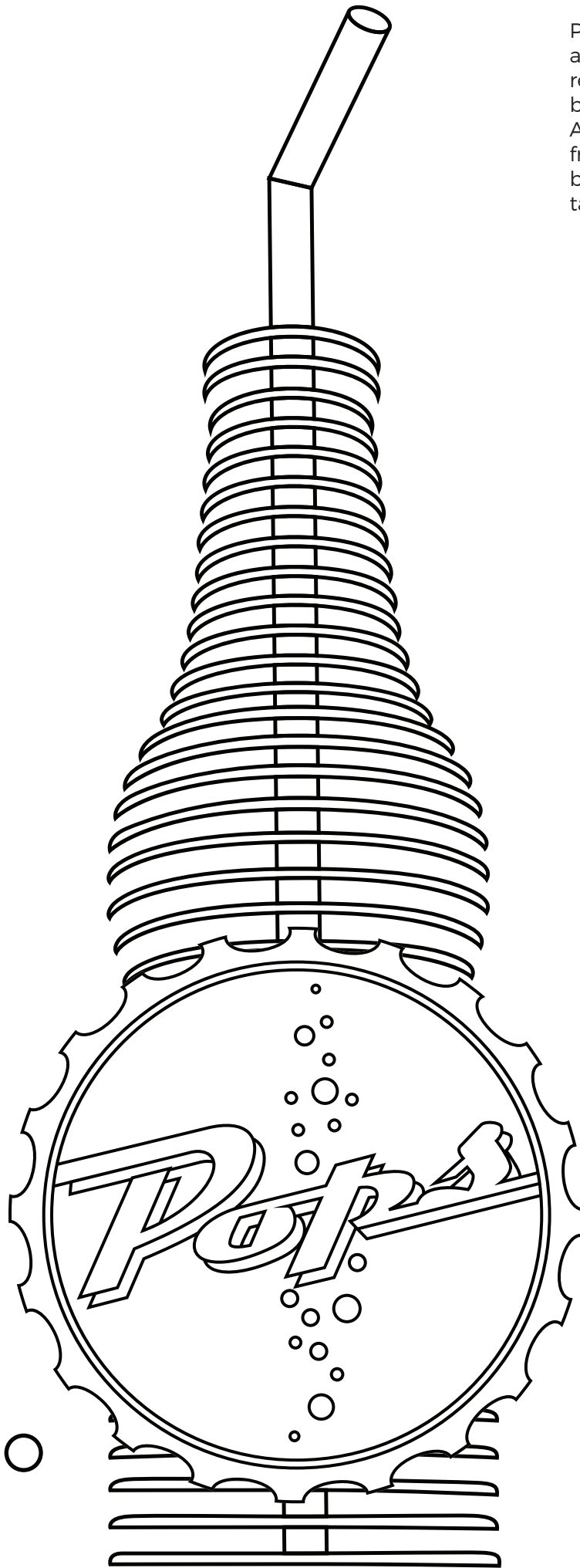
Oklahoma designated the elegant

state bird in 1951.



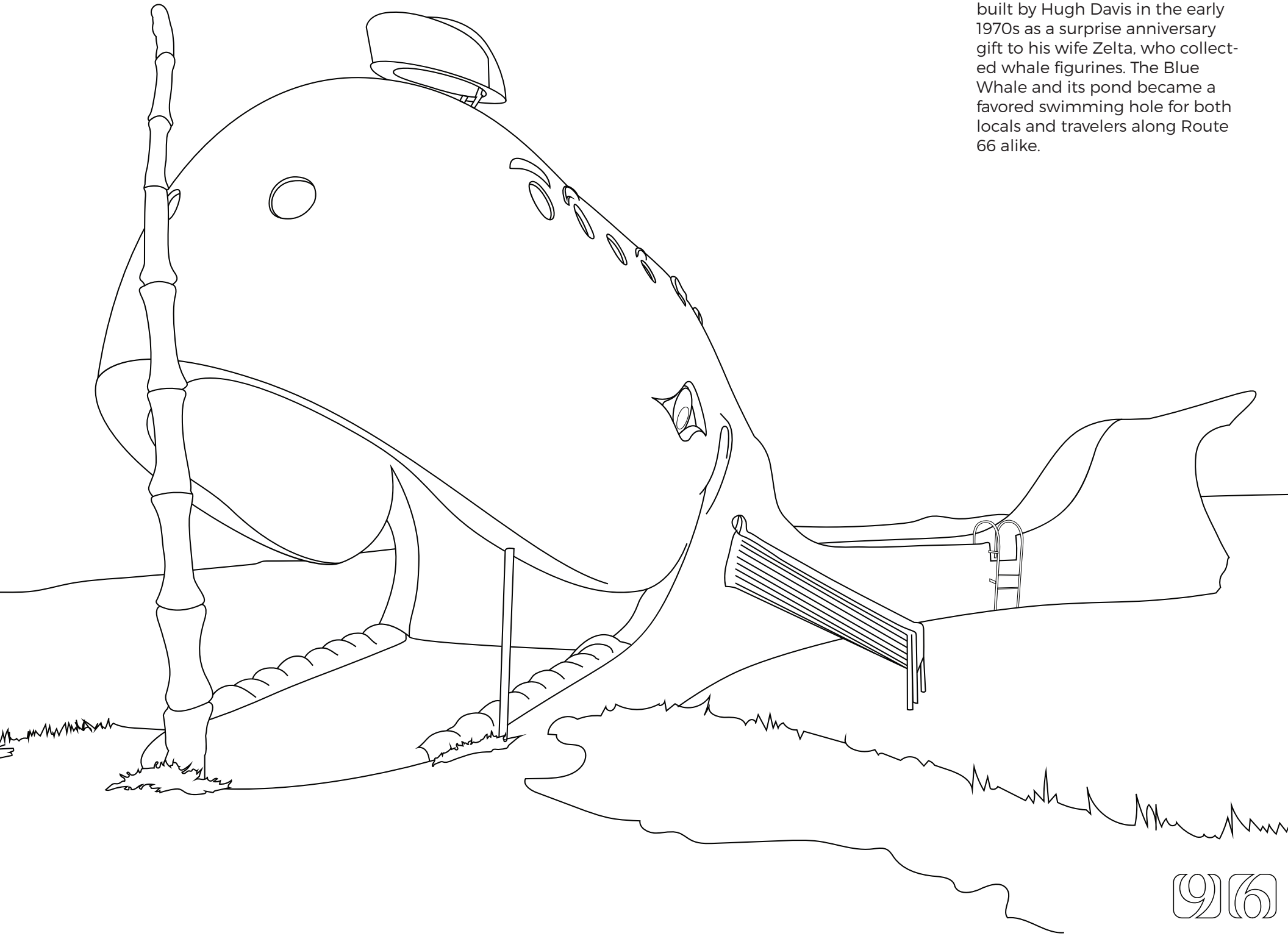


U.S. Route 66, also known as the Mother Road, was one of the original highways in the U.S. Highway System. Route 66 crosses 8 states and 3 time zones.

Pop's roadside sign is 66 feet tall and weighs 4 tons. The height is a reference to the historic highway beside which it is situated. Although seemingly constructed from neon tubes, it is actually lit by LEDs, which provide a spectacular light show each night.



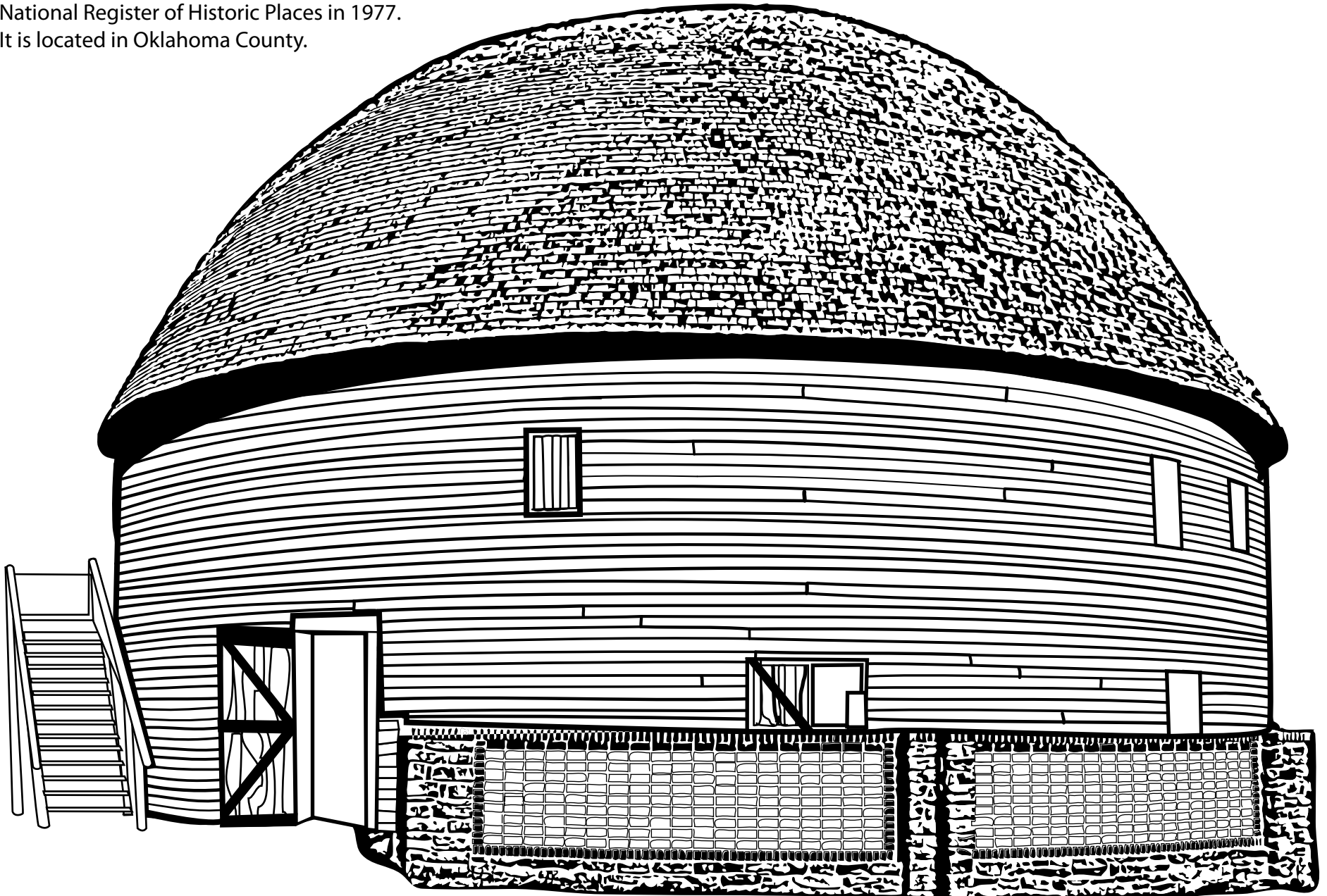
The Blue Whale of Catoosa was built by Hugh Davis in the early 1970s as a surprise anniversary gift to his wife Zelta, who collected whale figurines. The Blue Whale and its pond became a favored swimming hole for both locals and travelers along Route 66 alike.





# **The Arcadia Round Barn**

Built in 1898, the Arcadia Round Barn was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977. It is located in Oklahoma County.





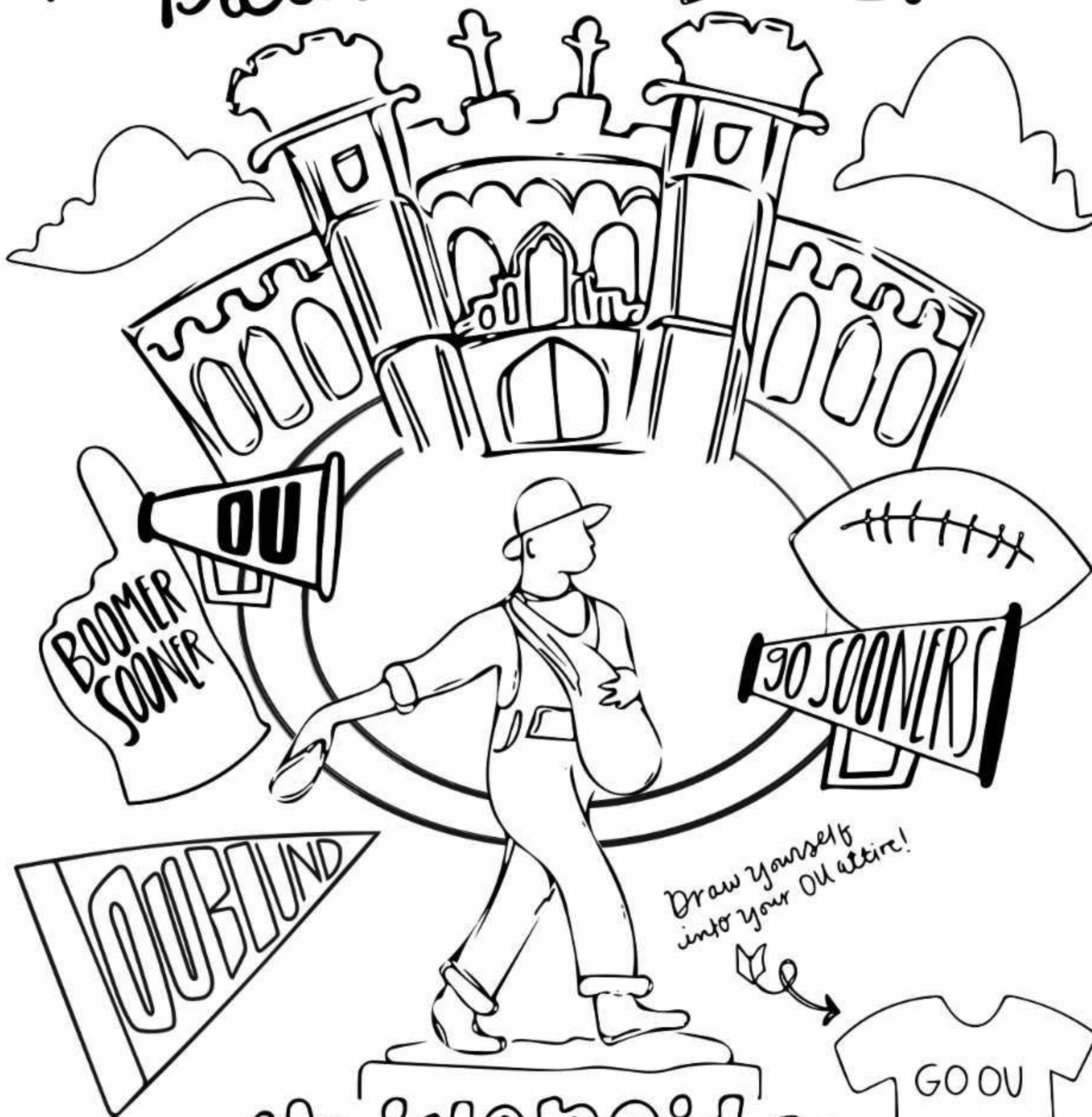
Oklahoma State University is located in Stillwater, Oklahoma. OSU is the home of America's Brightest Orange and their mascot, Pistol Pete.

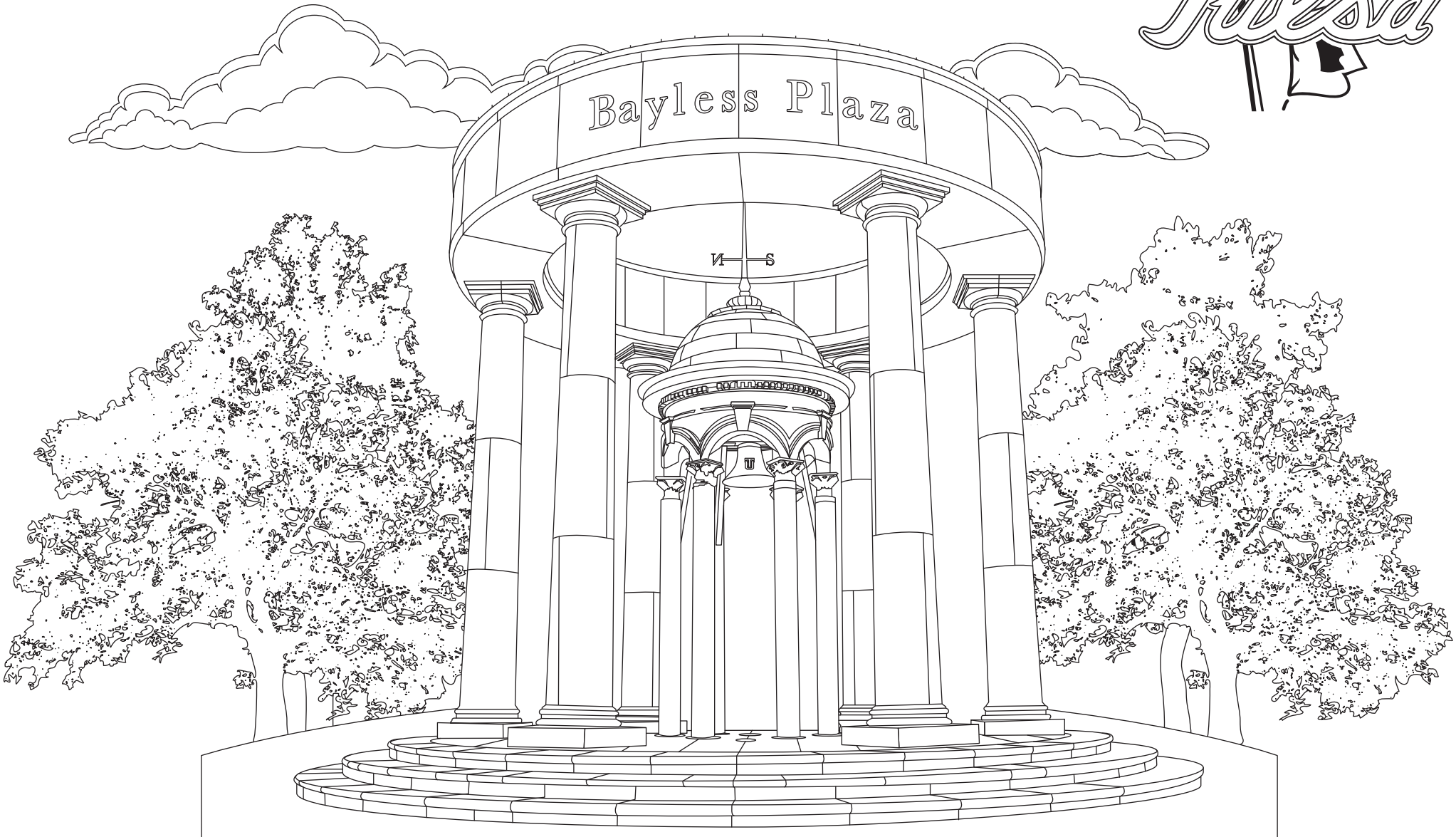
# The University of Oklahoma

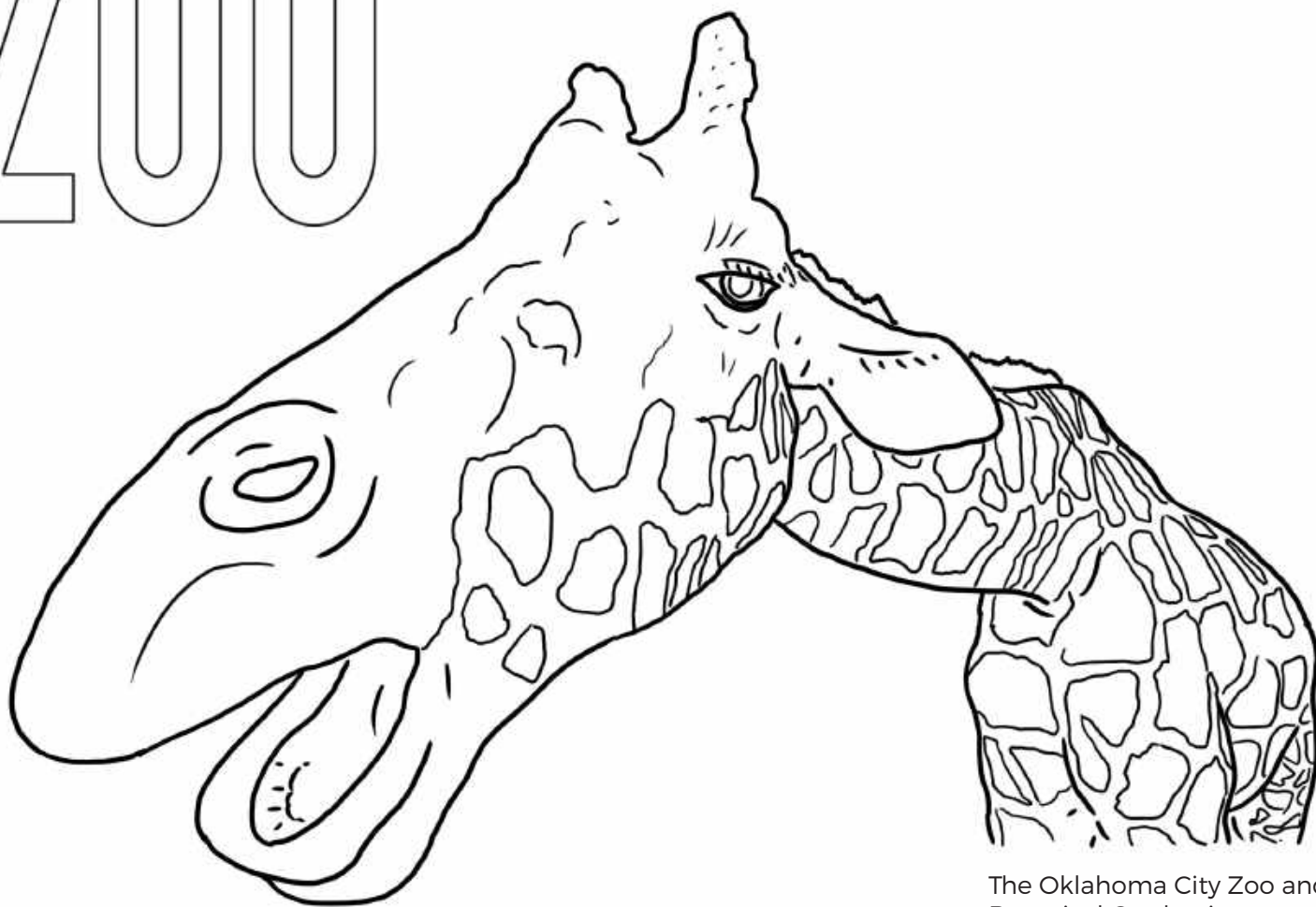
The University of Oklahoma is located in Norman, Oklahoma. OU is ranked in the top 25 of the most beautiful campuses in the United States.

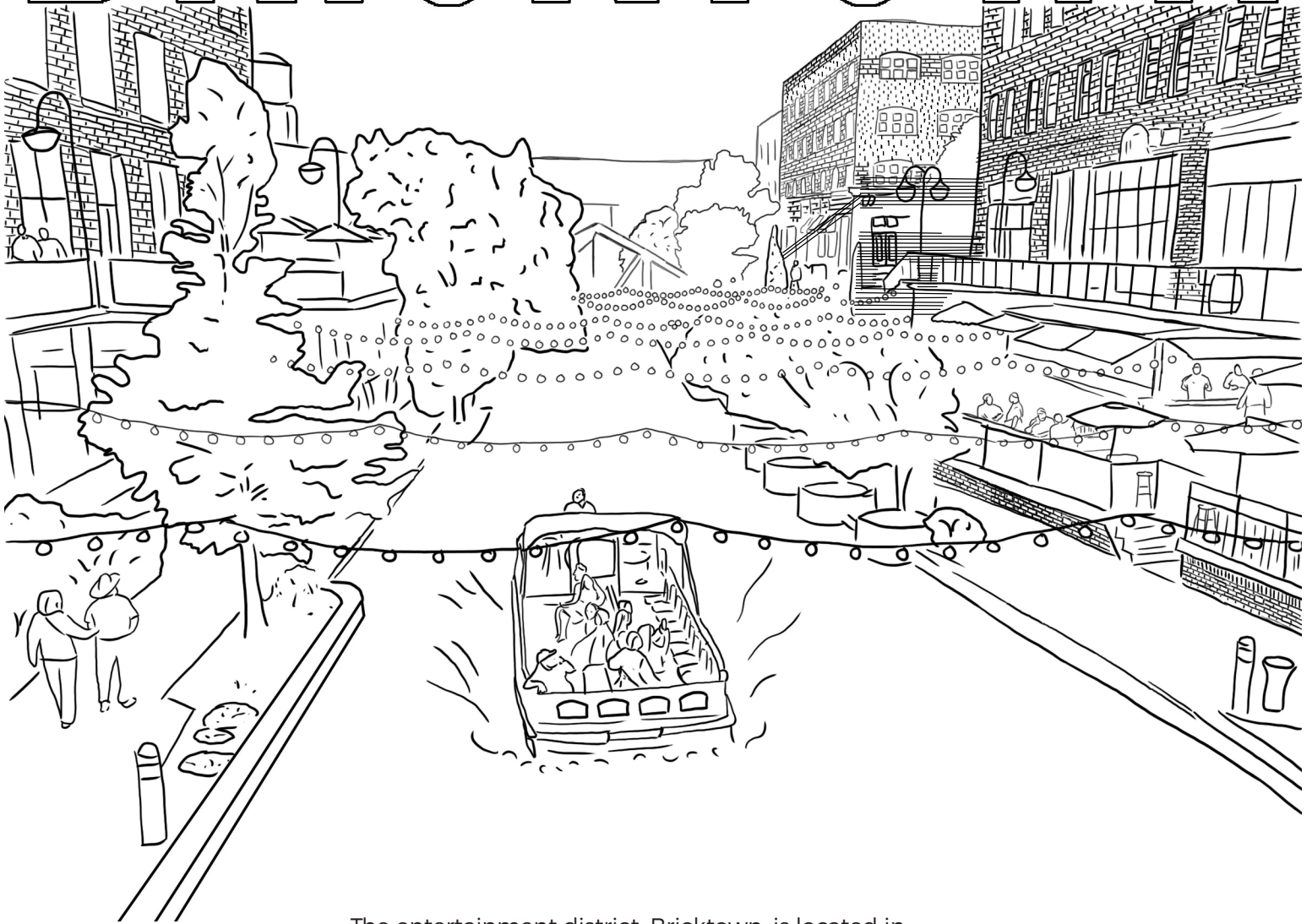

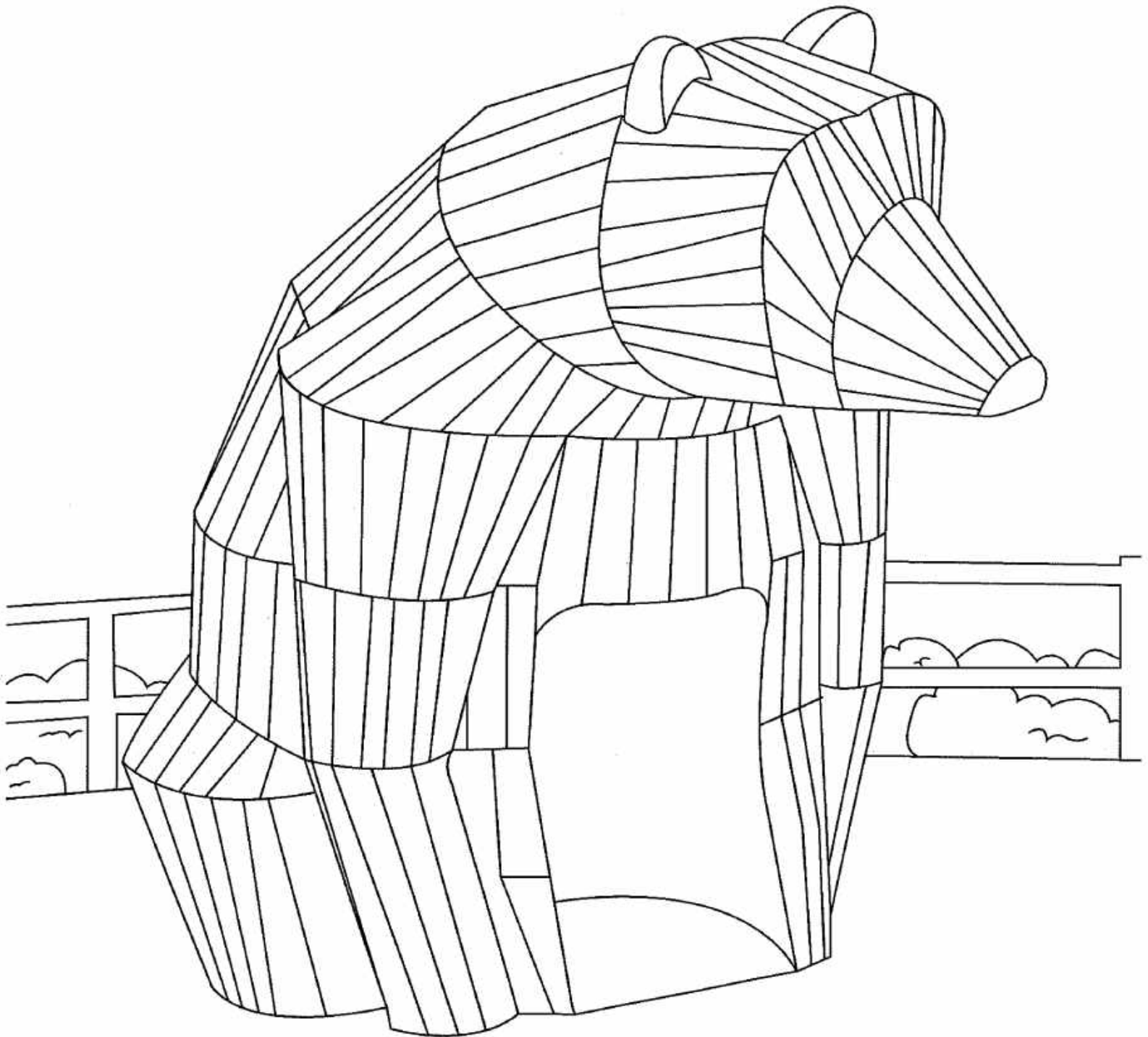

# BRICKTOWN



The entertainment district, Bricktown, is located in downtown Oklahoma City. Founded just days after the Land Run of 1889, Bricktown gained several improvements after the 1993 MAPS public facility enhancement project passed and is now home to a canal with Water Taxi boats, a baseball stadium, retail shops, restaurants, museums and galleries.

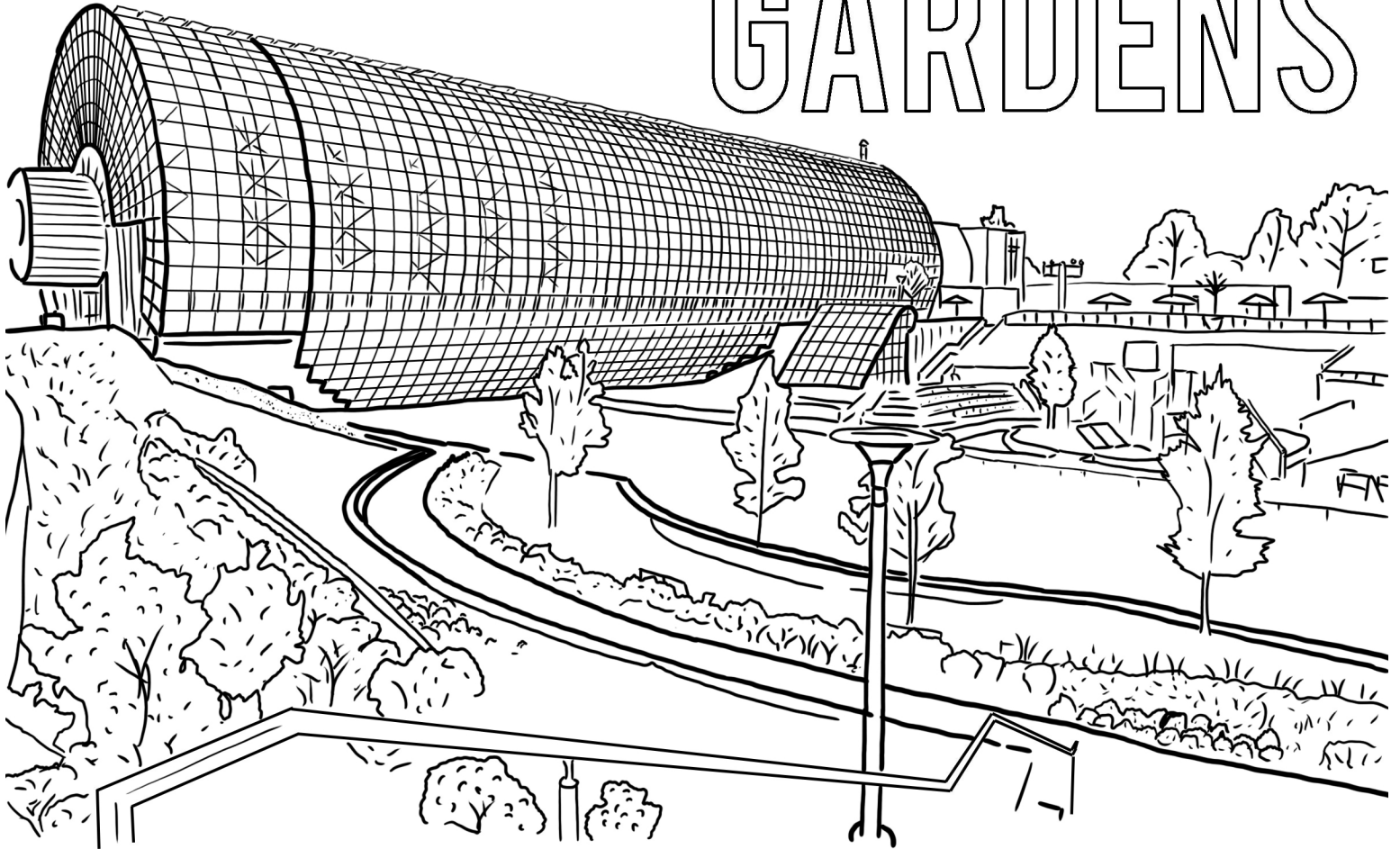

# MYRIAD BOTANICAL GARDENS



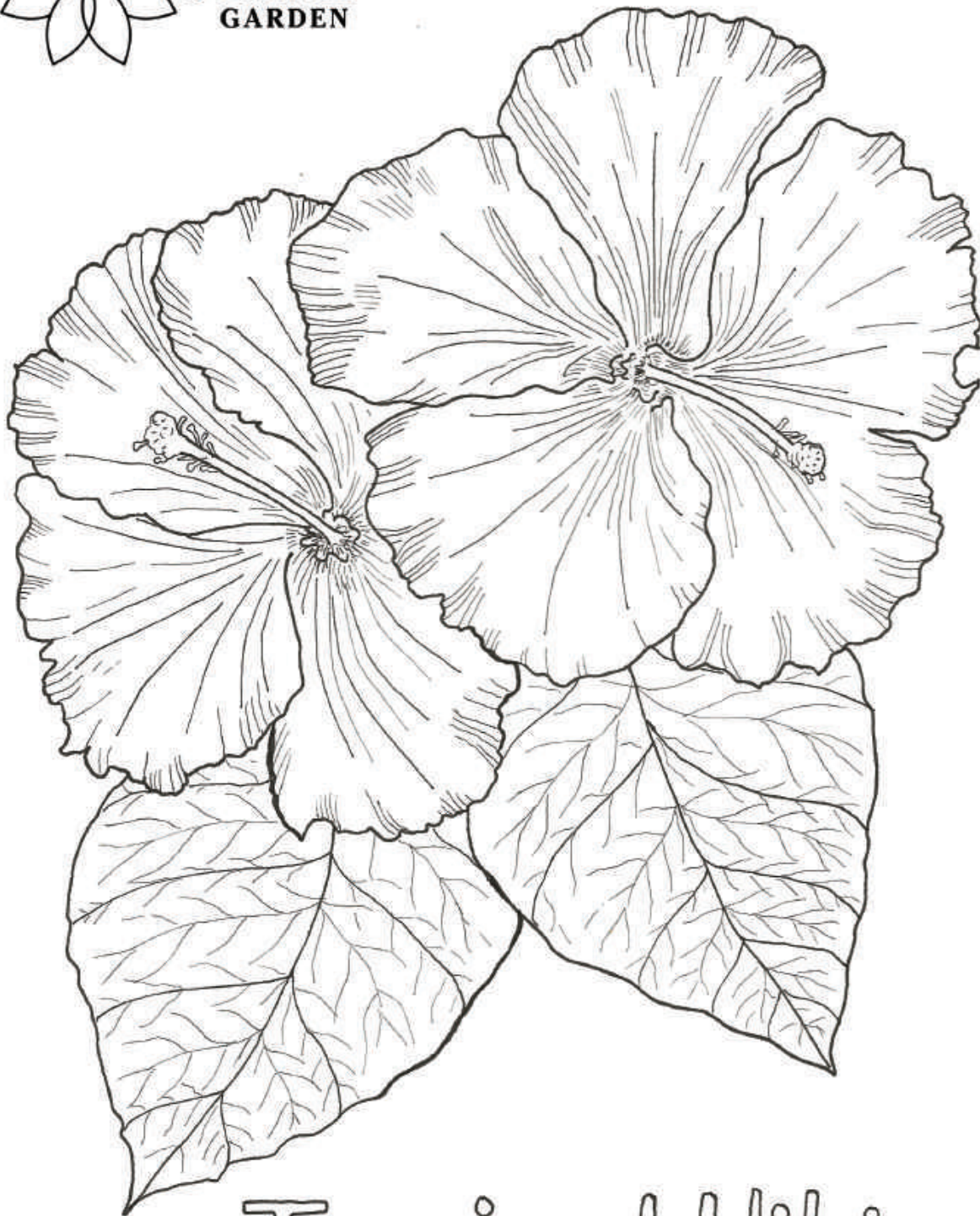

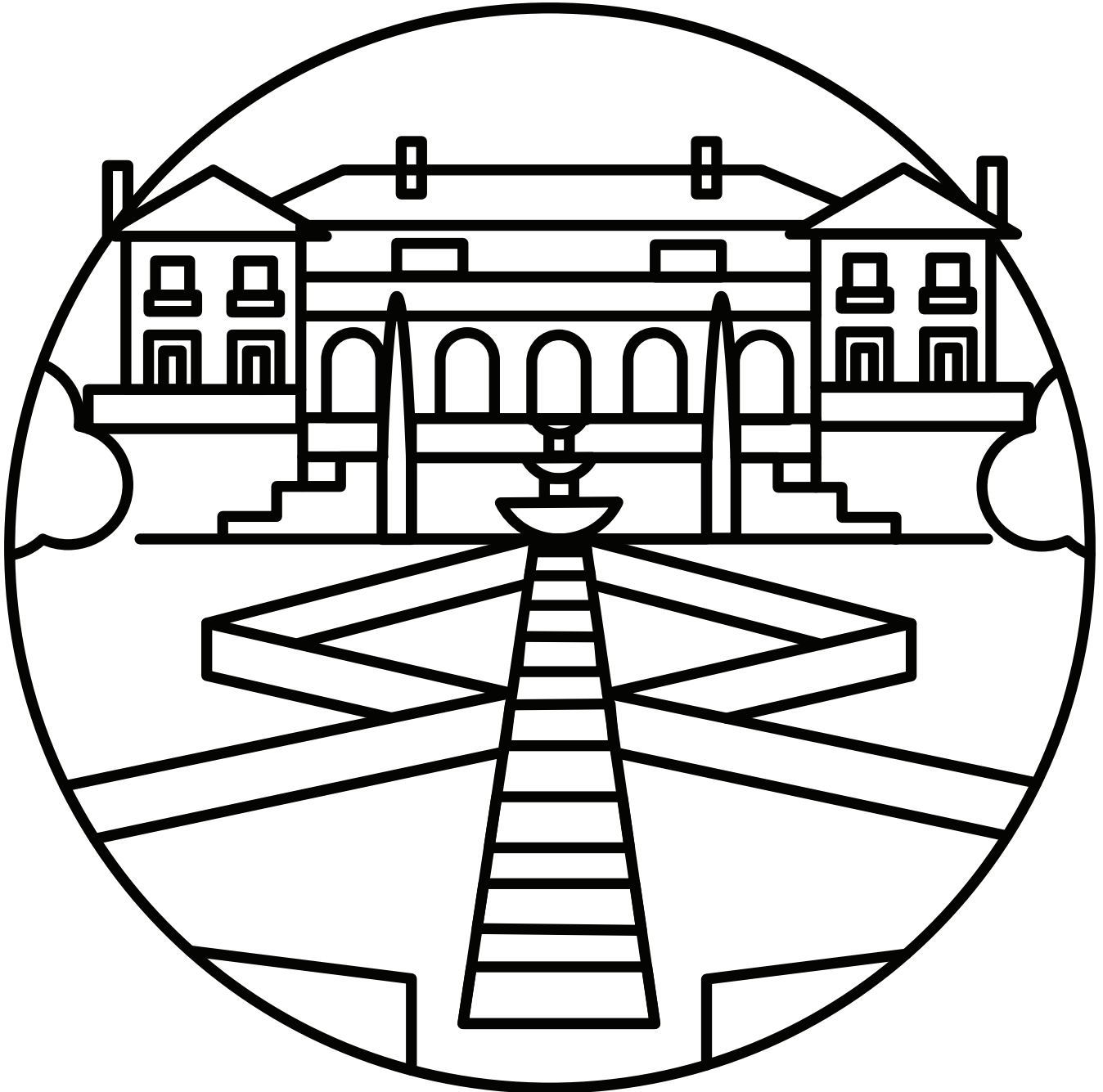

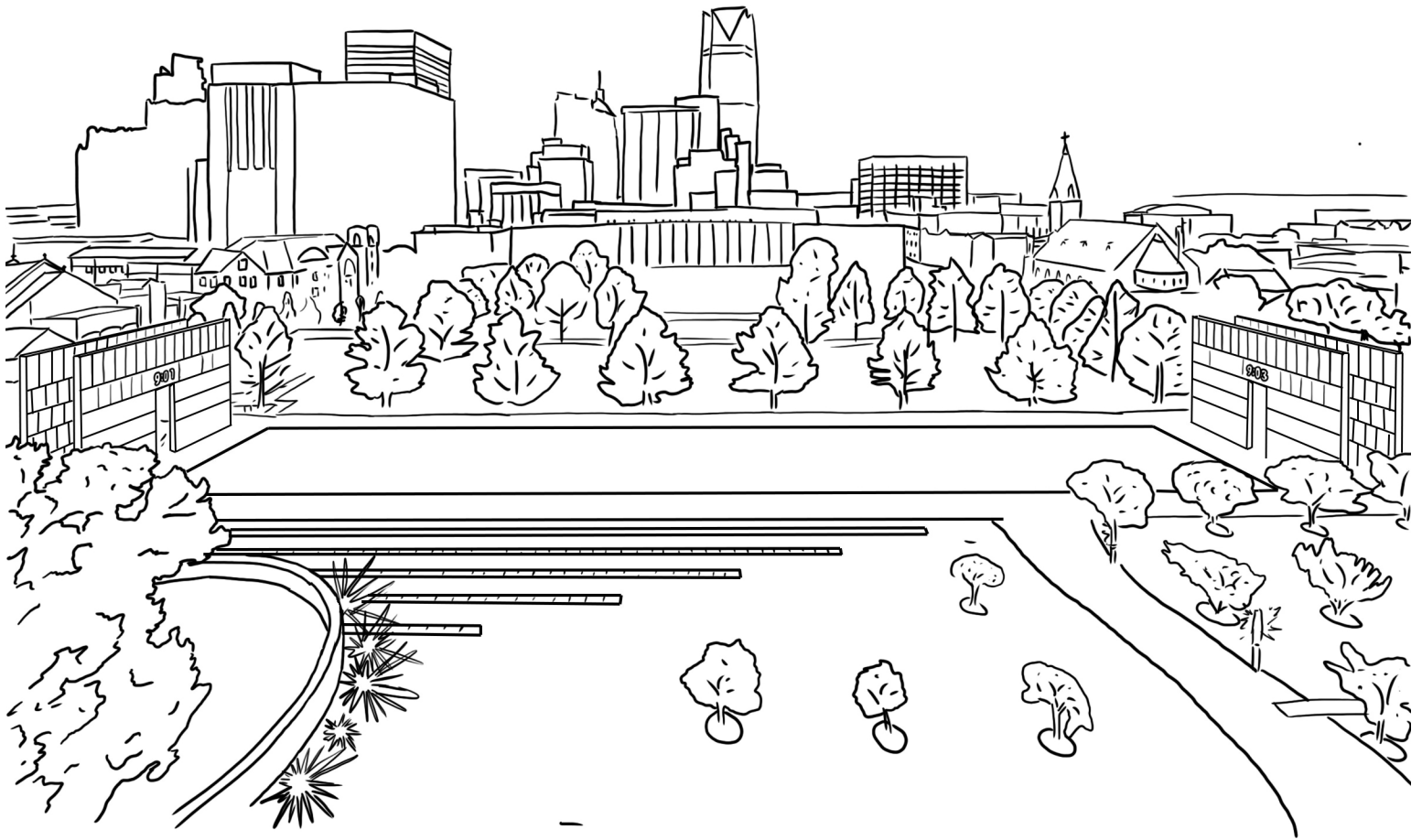
# Tropical Hibiscus

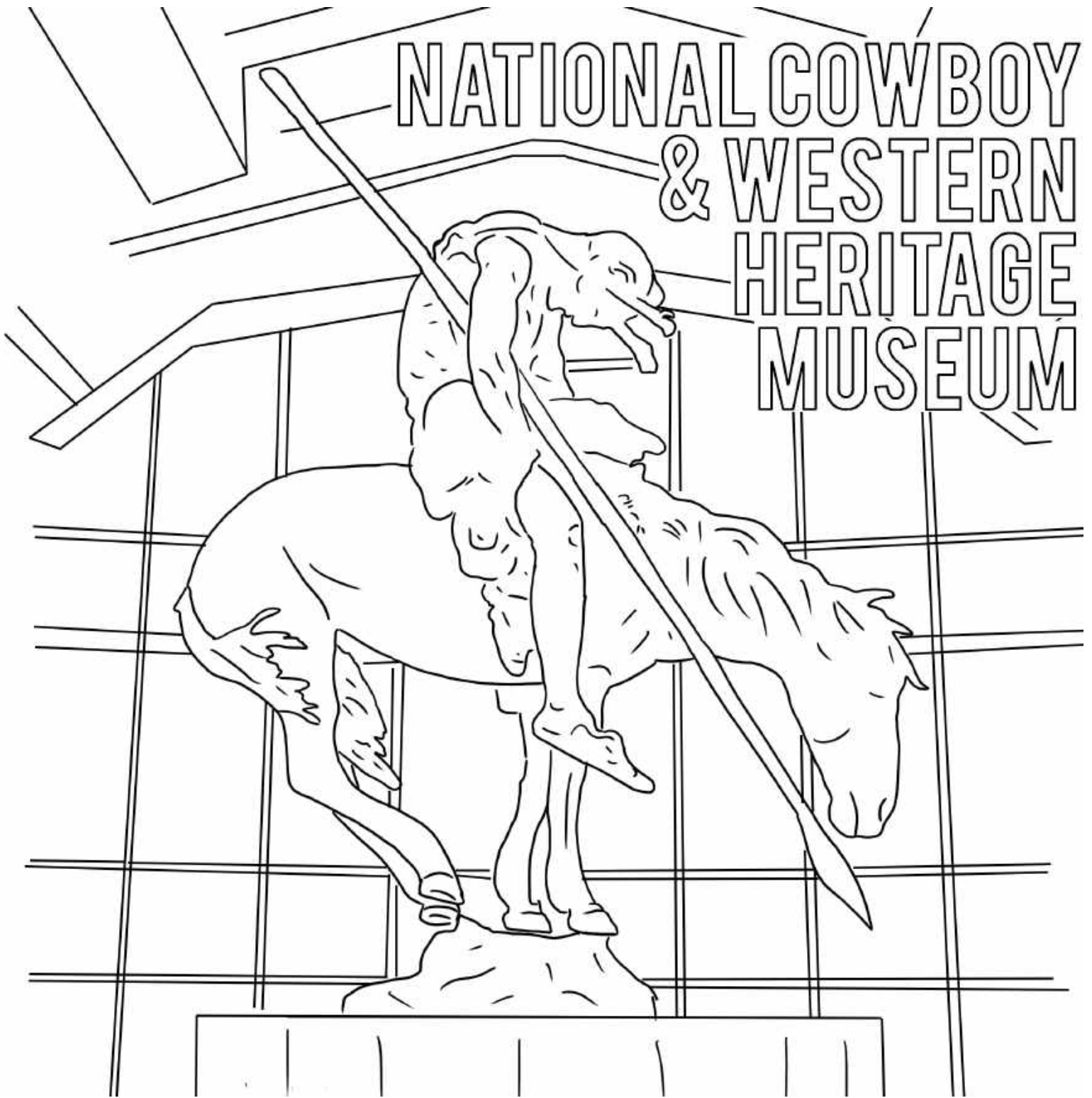
# NATIONAL MEMORIAL & MUSEUM

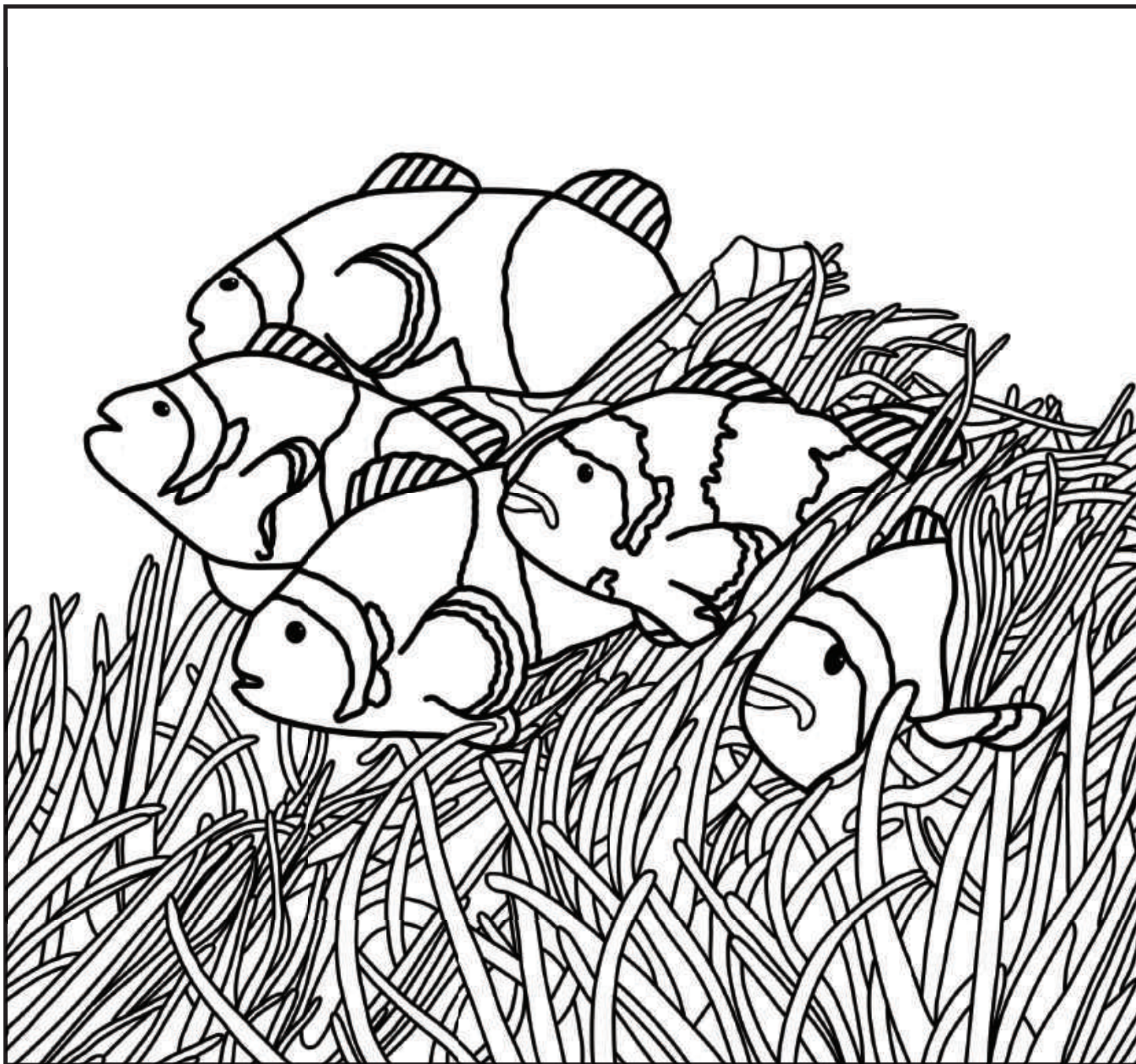
# NATIONAL COWBOY & WESTERN HERITAGE MUSEUM
